Special Notes-Financial Obligations:

Please note Section 9.6 of our Bylaws regarding Financial Obligations: All monthly financial obligations are due upon receipt. A late fee will be assessed on all past due accounts in an amount determined by the Board. Monthly financial obligations not paid within forty-five (45) days of the date on the billing statement shall be considered delinquent. Any member that is delinquent shall automatically be suspended from using all services of the Club until all delinquent financial obligations are paid in full. Dues and other recurring charges will continue to be billed to suspended members. Members who continue to be ninety (90) or more days delinquent may have their membership terminated and referred to an outside service for legal collection at the member's expense. At the discretion of the Board, if a member is suspended two (2) or more times in any twelve month period, special billing arrangement may be made for such Member including, but not limited to, monthly automatic payments.

Chef's Cravings:

By now you might have heard that we did our first Chef's Table last weekend. My staff and I had a blast cooking for the Bearden's! For the first course, we served a shrimp bisque with crispy edamame and the second course, a pistachio crusted yellowfin tuna with sweet wasabi and a salad with a lemon garlic oil dressing. The third course we offered, was grilled lamb chops, with a mint and pepper gnocchi, grilled Arkansas tomatoes, and a caramelized lemon. Last, but definitely not least, was the reese's crème brule with nutella mousse and a berry puree. This was a fun experience and we are looking forward to the next one. We also have a new menu starting this weekend. For the lunch, I've only changed a few items. We added the black bean burger so everyone can enjoy it inside and out, as its already on the pool menu. Another new item will be introducing is the FCCristo. It is our little twist on a monte cristo. I have tested it as a special and it was flying out of the kitchen with positive feedback, so now it can be enjoyed anytime. And last for lunch is the salmon burger. We will patty these in house and serve on a brioche bun with tartar sauce and bib lettuce.

For dinner we have also made a few minor changes. One being the change from the ribeye to our New York strip, which will be marinated in balsamic and garlic, served with a garlic and herb cheese. My favorite of the new items will be the double cut pork chop. This item will take a little longer to make, but is well worth it! It is brined in sweet tea, served blackened with pickled apples. Since beginning the occasional homemade pasta specials, we have decided to add the manicotti as a regular item. This will be stuffed with ricotta and basil and served with creamy marinara. Our last new dinner item will be the ginger chicken with cashews, served in its own broth. Enjoy!

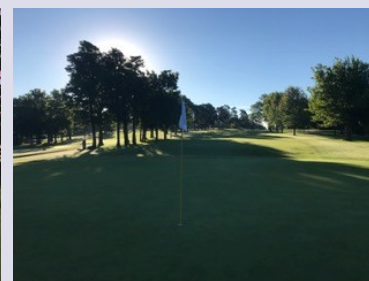

Considering they move four times as much air as the old fans, this should greatly benefit our putting surfaces. Many thanks to the club for its support of this project.

The recent AJGA Stacy Lewis Invitational was an exciting event for our staff. It was great to see the best young players in the country playing our venue. It seemed our course held its own and provided a good test to players we will no doubt be watching on TV in the coming years. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped make the tournament a great success.
